## **About Payment**

Your pay will be determined by:

- •How much do you pick each day
- •The quality of the berries you pick

You will receive holiday pay and have UK taxes & National Insurance deducted. You will be paid weekly directly into your UK bank account. You will also be given a pay slip showing what you have earned in the previous week, less any deductions.

The days when work may be available and the hours worked are crop and weather dependent. You will normally work up to 6 days a week, with activities arranged for you to participate in, if you'd like, when you have a day off.

The current (2025) minimum wage in the UK is £12.21 per hour, overtime will be paid at a rate of £15.26 after 48h. In 2024, on average, our pickers earned £550 per week.
